The Council of the City of Opelousas, Parish of St. Landry, State of Louisiana, convened in a regular session on this 12th day of March 2019 at 5:00 p.m.

With Mayor Julius Alsandor presiding, the meeting was called to order.

Mayor Alsandor requested the Clerk to call the roll and the following Council members were PRESENT: Marvin Richard, Milton Batiste III, Floyd Ford, Charles Cummings, Sherell Roberts, and Chasity Davis. ABSENT: None.

A moment of silent meditation was observed. Mayor Alsandor acknowledged the absence of the City Engineer William Jarrell, whose father passed away last evening. He also acknowledged the death of the 157 passengers on the Ethiopian flight overseas. Alderwoman Sherell Roberts led the Pledge of Allegiance and Rev. Calvin Moore led the Prayer.

Ms. Hall requested that the City put up some more blue lights around the City in recognition of Autism. Ms. Hall’s goal every year is to bless kids on the spectrum with tablets, trackers, sensory items, etc. To date, they have blessed almost 50 kids with these items. She stated that there has been a 12% increase in Autism over the last couple of years. She asked that the City come on one accord and go a little bit more “blue” to make a statement.

Recognition of Local High School Basketball Teams: Top 28 - North Central Hurricanes (Boys), Northwest Lady Raiders, and Opelousas Catholic Vikings (Boys). The Northwest High Lady Raiders Team (Coach Campbell) and the Opelousas Catholic Vikings Boys’ Team (Coach Dupre) were State Semi-Finalists. The North Central Hurricanes Boys’ Team (Coach Apphia Jordan—first female head coach) were 1A State Champions. Mayor Alsandor presented each team with a plaque of recognition and allowed the coaches and representatives from each team to speak.

PRESENTATIONS

Presentation by St. Landry Parish School Board Superintendent Patrick Jenkins. Superintendent Jenkins congratulated all of the basketball teams. He stated that they are working toward being a 3A school district, excelling in athletics, academics and the arts. Mr. Jenkins invited the public to attend the Special Board meeting of the St. Landry Parish School Board to talk about reconfiguration and consolidation of schools in order to be able to improve the quality of academics in St. Landry Parish and in Opelousas in particular. The meeting will be held on 03/13/2019 at 4:00 p.m. At that meeting, the Board will be considering three options: Option 1: K4 format and 1 school in 5th-6th grade format; Option 2: Pre-K facility, k-1 format, 2-3 format, 4-5 format, and 6th grade would go to Opelousas Junior High and/or MACA; Option 3: Four PreK-6 facilities. They feel that it is very important to provide equity and equality for every child in Opelousas. Alderwoman Davis asked if the school changes would cause some schools to be closed down. Supt. Jenkins stated it is a possibility and that at this time Southwest Elementary School and North Elementary School would be up for discussion. Alderwoman Davis asked how this would affect bus routes for after school programs should the schools close down. Supt. Jenkins stated that they would work on that particular part. Mr. Eric Williams asked if closing schools become a domino effect because where he is from this is what has happened. Supt. Jenkins stated that this would not be the case. He pointed out that the population in Opelousas has decreased tremendously. Last year, St. Landry Parish lost 274 students and of that number 170 of those students came from Opelousas. He stated that they have to do a better job of providing quality education so we don’t lose our students. Alderman Cummings asked Supt. Jenkins what is on the agenda for Park Vista Elementary. Supt. Jenkins stated that currently Park Vista is a PreK-6 grade school. Depending on the Option that is selected, 4th and 5th grades may have to go to another school. Mayor Alsandor stated that the City would be in partnership with the School Board. Attorney Broussard asked if the meeting that will be held on tomorrow be a public hearing where anyone can come up and ask questions on this topic. Supt. Jenkins stated yes the public will be allowed to ask questions on any items on the agenda within the allotted time. Mayor Alsandor thank Supt. Jenkins for being there.

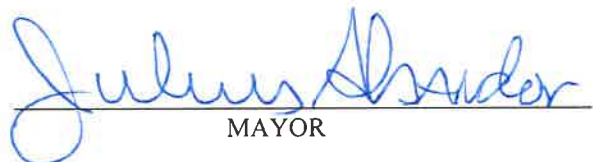
